LANGHAM CREEK BAND BOOSTER VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Chaperones – Chaperones are required every time the band travels throughout the year. At the beginning of each school year, **CFISD requires** that all potential chaperones go to the front office at Langham Creek to have their licenses scanned and their names added to the official band volunteer list. Band travel includes football games, marching contests, parades, region band, solo & ensemble, band trips and UIL concert events. Chaperones ride the buses with the students, fill water jugs, pass out plumes, pick up music flip folders and are on hand to assist as needed. If you sign up to chaperone, you will be contacted by email prior to each event (for games, usually the Monday before each game) to check your availability. No obligation required.

Summer and Fall Practice Help – Two parents are needed to attend each marching practice throughout the summer and fall to assist with first-aid issues. A first aid kit and detailed instructions are provided. If you sign up, you will be contacted by email in July as to which dates you would like to chaperone.

Marching Band Support – Help is needed in various areas. Parents assist in getting the electronics, percussion and pit equipment on and off the field before and after performances, announcing the band at the stadium during the half-time performance, and refilling band members' water jugs so they stay hydrated. Sewing also may be needed for making Color Guard flags or as other situations arise.

Uniform Support - Fitting, maintaining, laundering and distributing uniforms during marching and concert season.

Props - Building props for the show (painting, carpentry & metalworking is needed – no experience necessary).

Hospitality Committee – You don't need to be a baker to serve on this committee which provides desserts, snacks, and treats for various events throughout the year. Members are contacted via email prior to each event to see if they can help. Home-baked or store-bought goods are welcome.

Socials – (Chili Cook-Off, Hotdog Socials, Band Olympics, Ice Cream Socials, Luau) – There are many opportunities to help with student socials. We need volunteers to help with organizing games, setting up, preparing food, purchasing needed items, grilling, serving and cleaning up.

Corporate Sponsorship - Distributing literature to businesses and individuals for sponsorship, sending thank you notes and maintaining corporate sponsor benefits such as concert program ads, logos for t-shirt, and award plaques. Volunteers needed to solicit new sponsors (by mail, in person or on-line), support existing sponsors, and help with planning or do computer work.

Fundraising – The band participates in multiple fundraisers throughout the year such as car washes, tamales sales, cookie dough sales, a TX Roadhouse lunch, Ink cartridge collection & recycling, etc. In order to be successful, all families are needed to support our fundraising efforts.

Rock-a-Thon Committee – Rock-a-thon is the band's largest fundraiser. The students gather donations to gain entrance to this all night lock-in event. They participate in karaoke, jump in inflatables, watch movies and have a lot of fun! Volunteers help to plan, set up, chaperone and clean-up after this event. You'll have almost as much fun as the kids!

Texans Game – For a donation, our band provides volunteers (parents and students) to pass out the giveaway at a one Texan Game each year.

Silent Auction Committee – A silent auction is held every December in conjunction with the winter concert and dinner. It is our second largest fundraiser for the year. Help is needed in obtaining donations, setting up displays, setting prices, working the auction, general set up and clean-up.
